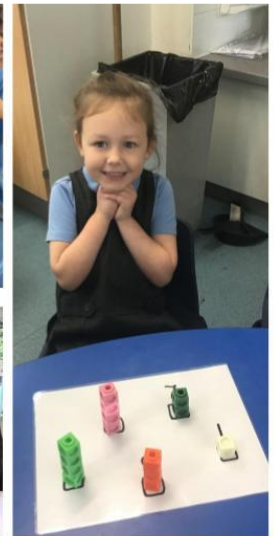

PC Ian's assembly

I was very grateful that PC Ian came in to speak to the whole school on Monday. There are lots of exciting events happening over the next couple of weeks such as Halloween and Bonfire Night. However, with the reduced daylight hours along with such events, it is wise to reiterate certain messages about staying safe. PC Ian reminded the children of the following:

- To not go trick or treating without an adult and only go to the houses that have decorations outside
- To be aware of the roads and apply normal road safety, making sure that you can be seen by other road users.
- To know the Firework safety code, not to play with fireworks or return to them, even if they appear to be dead and to know that sparklers need to be handled with care whilst wearing gloves.

Uniform checks after half term

My colleagues and I have become aware of children not conforming to our uniform policy ([which can be found here](#)). We are particularly concerned about excessive jewellery and how this impacts on PE lessons. Here is an extract from our current uniform policy on jewellery:

*On health and safety grounds, we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school. The exceptions to this rule are a single, **plain**, ear-ring stud in each pierced ear. We ask the children either to remove these before PE and games, or to cover them with a plaster (supplied from home).*

Concerns have also been raised about hairstyles which could be described as extreme and somewhat distracting. Please see relevant extract from our current policy:

The school does not permit children to have haircuts that could serve as a distraction to other children. (For example - mohicans and coloured hair.) Long hair should be tied up, this is particularly important during PE.

I will ask all class teachers to check adherence to our uniform policy after half term, providing feedback to parents where appropriate. I do hope that you can support us in this endeavour.

Christmas performances and class assemblies

For those wishing to 'save the date' we have now fixed class assemblies in the Autumn and Spring Term (See Dates for the Diary). We have also decided on our EYFS Christmas performance dates. Parents of children performing at these events are welcome to attend and more details will be provided in due course We will keep you informed as more events are added to the diary.

Baseline reports and parent consultations

For children in Y1 to Y6, baseline reports will be issued on Monday 7th November. The following week, parents will be able make appointments to see their children's class teacher on Monday 14th and Thursday 17th between 1530 and 1830hrs. You will receive a link to book appointments after half term.

Flu Immunisation

The Dorset School Immunisation Service will be in Downlands on **Tuesday 15th November** to administer the Flu vaccine for pupils in Reception (FS2) to Year 6. The vaccination is a quick and simple spray up the nose

To enable your child to have the vaccination you will need to go online to submit the form. You should have received the link by email on Oct 14th . A form must be submitted no later than **Thursday 10th November**. If the form is submitted too late your child will not be able to be immunised at school, and you will need to make a clinic appointment in a community venue instead.

Please remember that **Monday 31st October** is our 4th training day, so children will return to school on Tuesday 1st November. In the meantime, I wish you and your family a happy and healthy half term.
