


### The Downlands Pupil Passport








#### All About Me

They draw a **self portrait** of themselves and list their favourite: lesson, book, food as well as any hobbies.






### My Downlands Journey

# The Downlands Pupil Passport




### **Learning Goals**




### Significant People

When a pupil learns about one of these, they get a **photo** to stick in their passport and they then write a short sentence explaining why this person is important.






### My Library
