

I hope you and your family are well. This mega (8 week term) has finally come to an end and I will present some highlights of the past two weeks and share some important information for after the half term holidays.


Attendance

Good school attendance improves your child's chances of success in life. There is clear evidence of the link between good attendance at school and high levels of achievement. Pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths in 2019 had an overall absence rate of 4.7% over the key stage, compared with 3.5% among pupils who achieved the expected standard and 2.7% among those who achieved the higher standard.



House points for Values Awards

It's still early days, but Falcon have made a strong start. Remember that house points are awarded for all school based achievements given at Gold Book Assembly this year, so those numbers will rise quickly.

Parent Consultations

Our Autumn Parent Consultations will be on Monday 11th and Thursday 14th November between 1530 and 1830hrs. Following feedback from parents, we have chosen to make these consultations more structured so that teachers can talk about details which have, in the past, been presented on baseline reports. We will not send baseline reports this year - we received feedback that they were a bit confusing and provided more questions than answers – but all children will receive a detailed end-of-year report. However, I have asked all teachers to cover set themes (see below) about your child's learning at this early stage in the school year. Therefore, these parent consultations may feel different as there will be more specific information shared via this face-to-face method. We will send out more information about how to book appointments for these consultations on Monday 4th November.

Zoe supports Armed Forces Families (whether they are currently serving/veterans or reservists' families) to ensure they receive appropriate advice and guidance when navigating the NHS systems, liaising with local authority departments such as housing, finance, education, or other support agencies along with assisting those transitioning and leaving the service.
