






Nativities


House Matters


Attendance

Support for inter-parental communication

Are you and your partner or co-parent experiencing relationship problems?

The festive season can bring extra pressure on families, with added responsibilities, financial worries, and heightened emotions. If you're finding that these challenges are creating or worsening conflicts in your relationship, you're not alone.

The SIPCo (Support for Inter-Parental Communication) project is offering FREE relationship therapy to selected parents in Dorset with children aged 8–14. Funded through the Youth Endowment Fund and delivered by Tavistock Therapy, the project uses therapeutic approaches to help parents reduce conflict.
