Dear Parents and Guardians,

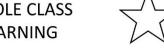

Attendance

At the start of the school year, I wanted to remind all families of how important regular school attendance is. Every day your child attends school supports their learning, friendships, and confidence. Research shows that even small amounts of missed time can add up to big gaps in learning. That's why we ask for your support in making attendance a priority.

I wrote to everyone this week setting out our approach in more detail and our attendance policy can be found on our website. Every 2 weeks, I will share the attendance rates of our Houses in order to motivate children to attend school even on days when they might be feeling under the weather or worried in some way. The NHS have helpful information presented here to help parents decide if their child is too ill to attend school. We

have support systems in place to support your child if they are experiencing any anxiety about attending school, including colleagues trained in Emotional Based School Avoidance – a nationwide programme.

School nurse drop in sessions

On Thursday 9th October at 0915hrs, the school nurse team will be in school for parent drop in sessions. They will be on hand to talk about common parental concerns such as sleep patterns, behaviour, toileting issues and head lice. Please do attend the school on this day in order to take advantage of this offer.

Harvest Festival – Wednesday 1st October, 0900hrs

Padre Stokes is leading our Harvest Assembly on Wednesday 1st October at 9am and you are very welcome to join us. Space in the hall is limited and we ask that only 1 adult per family attends.

Once again, we are supporting the Blandford Food Bank and would be grateful if food donations could be either given to your child for their teacher or alternatively dropped into the container in the School's Main Foyer prior to the Assembly on Monday or Tuesday of week commencing 29th September 2025.

The Food Bank is in need of the following items: Tinned meat, Tinned veg, Tinned potatoes, Pasta/curry sauces, Tinned puddings, Pasta, Rice, Biscuits, Cereals, UHT milk

Any food however with an expiry date of more than 6 months will I'm sure be very welcome.

Finally, I would remind all parents that we are already experiencing very changeable weather and we would like children to be outside for breaktimes as much as possible. Therefore, please ensure that your child(ren) have coats to wear during the Autumn/Winter terms.
